A Specific Learning Disorder (SLD) affects how a person learns academic skills, such as reading, writing, or maths.

People often use words like dyslexia, dysgraphia, or dyscalculia to refer to SLDs.

There are 3 main types of SLDs.



- Dyslexia: difficulty with reading
- Dysgraphia: difficulty with spelling and writing
- Dyscalculia: difficulty with maths

SLDs are lifelong, but the right help makes a big difference.



For example, direct interventions, learning support at school, and appropriate tools & strategies.

SLDs are brain-based.

They are not caused by laziness, low intelligence, teaching or parenting styles, or too much screen time.
